3. Course for Winter 2015: Disease Ecology

- VME (Veterinary Medicine and Epidemiology) 158: Infectious Disease in Ecology and Conservation.
- This course integrates ecological theory and application. Students interpret ecological approaches and models for understanding disease and then study particular diseases to develop their fundamental skills in ecology an epidemiology. The course also promotes communication between graduate and undergraduate students as well as veterinarians, wildlife biologists, epidemiologists, and basic ecologists.

- The undergraduate course is VME 158, and the **CRN is 92564**. The instructor for this course will be Dr. Janet Foley. For more information, please contact Dr. Foley at <u>jefoley@ucdavis.edu</u>.
- The course format will be 2 lectures per week, on Mondays and Wednesdays from 3:10-4:30.
- This course can also count toward some Animal Science specializations, depending on faculty adviser approval.

4. Course for Winter 2015: Forage Crop Production and Management

- PLS 112: Forage Crop Production and Management.
- This course will discuss fundamentals of forage crop production and management, discuss how to optimize both forage production and animal nutritive value, and consider the impact on environmental services from including forage crops in an agroecosystem. The focus will be on forages important to California, particularly alfalfa and range grasses, but the course will also compare and contrast systems throughout the US and around the world.
- PLS 112 is a 3 unit course, and will be offered Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 8:00-8:50 am in 116 Veihmeyer Hall. The instructor will be Dr. Charlie Brummer, you may contact him via email at <u>ecbrummer@ucdavis.edu</u>.
- This course can also count towards the restricted electives for Agriculture and Environmental Education majors.

6. Wildlands Studies Information Session

- There will be a Wildlands Studies Student Information session on Tuesday, November 18th, at 4:00 pm in the Weir Room, 2154 Meyer Hall. Pizza will be provided!
- Wildlands Studies field projects provide students with the opportunity to join backcountry study teams as working field associates, studying environmental impact assessment, environmental policy, geologic, climatic, and topographic factors that support various habitats, and the relationships between environments and culture.
- Each program grants 4-12 units of upper division semester credit that easily transfers to UC Davis. These courses could count towards your specialization. Project teams consist of 8-16 participants working with a course instructor who provides onsite instruction and directs all field study activities.
- This season students can choose from 18 wildlife, wildland, and cultural ecology field studies, all searching for solutions to environmental and cultural challenges. Field studies will take place in Yellowstone, Big Sur (California), Banff (Canada), California Channel Islands, Vancouver Island, Fiji, Belize, South Africa, Argentina, Peru, Chile, Thailand, Nepal, Indian Himalaya, Costa Rica, Panama, Australia, and New Zealand.

7. Study Abroad Updates:

- Enrollment for UC Davis Summer Abroad 2015 opens on January 7th, 2015. Here is a brief update on some of the programs offered for Summer Abroad:
 - o Europe: Genetics The Global Language of Biology
 - Study and experience the great genetic breakthroughs in this grand European tour of genetics: Cambridge, Paris, Vienna, and Stockholm and more! This course counts for BIS 101.
 - Thailand: Microbiology Lab in the Kingdom of Smiles
 - Get class credits for a life science laboratory that will involve you in exploring tropical jungles, pristine beaches, exotic markets and the mega-city of Bangkok. This course counts for MIC 101.
 - o Bolivia, India, South Africa: Health Internships
- All students enrolled in a UC Davis Summer Abroad program will also have the opportunity to apply for a Study Abroad award. Recipients will receive awards in amounts from \$500-\$2,000. Application timeline: January 5 March 3, 2015.

9. Master's Degrees in Public Health: Information Session Webinars

- Want to learn more about Public Health? Interested in earning a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree at UC Davis?
- The UC Davis MPH program is hosting Admissions Requirements & Information Session online webinars this Fall. Hear from the Program Associate Director, Diana Cassady, and alumni about the program requirements, admissions process, and to see if the program is a fit for you.

- The UC Davis MPH program is designed for people interested in disease prevention and community health. The program includes instruction in epidemiology, biostatistics, environmental and occupational health, health services and administration, and social and behavioral science, and prepares students for an expanding range of professional opportunities and roles in public health and medicine.
- The 56-unit graduate program can be completed in 14 months. Most students graduate after completing a summer session, three academic quarters, and a summer practicum placement. The application deadline is **January 15th** of each year.
