A. Announcements / Upcoming Events

1. 4th Annual Beef Improvement Seminar

2. Study Abroad Updates

- Enrollment for Quarter Abroad 2015 opens on January 7th! Study Abroad awards are available to Fall Quarter Abroad participants, ranging from \$500 to \$2000. Students who enroll by March 3rd are eligible to apply.

- The UCEAP (University of California Education Abroad Program) application deadline for many Fall 2015 programs is January 16th.
- There are ten UC Davis faculty-led Quarter Abroad programs are planned for next year. Below is a list of some of the programs offered:
 - <u>Australia: Internship and Writing Program (Sydney)</u>
 Complete an intensive internship in the career field of your choice while taking three upper division University Writing Program (UWP) courses. Students can also intern at a vet clinic during their study.
 - <u>Mexico: Latino/a Health Internship Program (Oaxaca)</u>
 Gain a better understanding of your health profession career goals while taking classes on transnational (US-Mexico) health issues. Participate in internships in hospitals and clinics in Oaxaca.

- UCEAP offers many quarter/semester-long programs in the fall. You can study at world-renowned Universities, immerse yourself in another language and academic culture, or take language classes. Below is a list of some of the programs offered:
 - <u>Botswana: University of Botswana</u>
 Explore African perspectives on development, with a special track in public health. A community practicum/internship is available.
 - <u>Denmark: University of Copenhagen</u> Study in the exciting learning environment of the University of Copenhagen, one of Europe's leading universities. Along with course work in the social sciences and humanities, particularly strong course offerings are available in the sciences. Students can also satisfy some of the ANS major requirements, and intern at the University's veterinary teaching hospital.
 - Japan: Engineering & Science in English, Tohoku University Participate in directed laboratory research in the health sciences. Students develop key research methods and end the program and present their findings to their peers.
 - <u>United Kingdom: University of Edinburgh</u> This immersion program provides students with courses in various fields in Scotland's premier university. Students can also satisfy some of the ANS major requirements.

2. Position Available for Miniature Swine Translational Research

- Dr. Kristin Grimsrud, an investigator at UC Davis, is looking for a part-time person to assist with current research projects.
- Their current research is focused on using miniature swine as a translational model for chronic heart disease to evaluate the efficacy of stem cell therapy. This position entails caring for the animals used in the studies, but there may be opportunities to assist with prepping and recovering for surgeries and gain further research experience.
- This study takes place at both UC Davis and Travis Air Force Base, so a background check is required for clearance and people in this position must be able to commute. Travis Air Force Base is located in Fairfield, CA, about 34 minutes from Davis.
- This position is ideal for someone interested in graduate school or vet school, and in particular they are looking **for current seniors or recent graduates** for this position.

3. Student Assistant Position: UC Davis Livestock Air Quality Program

- This Student Assistant position entails participating in research studies for the Department of Animal Science Air Quality Mitloehner Laboratory. The research studies are centered on management and feeding strategies to mitigate emissions from livestock production systems.
- Responsibilities and duties in this position include handling and feeding cattle during research trials, administering any necessary medications, assisting veterinarians in medical procedures, running cattle through a chute, and assisting in milking processes. Note that with feeding, shifts may start anywhere from 4:30-6:00am, daily.
- Large animal experience and experience operating farm machinery is preferred, but not required for this position. Minimum time commitment is 15 hours per week. The ability to work on weekends or holidays is preferred.
