# 2. Barn Residency Application Now Available!

- The Barn Residency Application for all of the Animal Science Department Facilities is NOW AVAILABLE! Applications are due to 2215 Meyer Hall by March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 5:00pm
- Barn Residency is a program that allows students to live and work at the Animal Science facilities, and exchange 10 hours of work per week for free housing. Selection into the program is competitive, but having

- prior experience with a particular species (i.e., through internships at the facilities or ANS 49 classes) helps strengthen your application.

#### 3. Young Cattlemen's Association: Al Clinic

- The 2015 Al Clinic will be held **March 23-25**, **2015**. The clinic will be taught by veterinarians from the UC Davis Vet School. Registration is first come, first serve. The clinic cost is \$400, which includes an Al handbook, hands-on practice, and lunch. The first \$75 is due as a deposit by **March 9**<sup>th</sup>, and the remaining \$325 is due by **March 18**<sup>th</sup>.

## 4. Study Abroad Updates

- This summer, you can complete your BIS 101 requirement while studying at the prestigious Cambridge University, visit the monastery and greenhouse of Gregor Mendel, and explore Stockholm, the city of the Nobel Prize, through participation in UC Davis Summer Abroad!
- The two summer abroad programs available are Genetics: The Global Language of Biology, and Genetics: From Mendel to Genomes.
- Each of the programs are four weeks long, during Summer Session 2. You can earn 8 credits while abroad, for coursework equivalent to BIS 101 and MCB 198. A 2.0 GPA is required. Summer Abroad will also be enforcing the completion of BIS 2A, BIS 2B, and CHE 8A/118A before departure.
- Financial aid applies to these programs.

## 3. Junior Specialist Position Open

- This is a great opportunity for graduating students looking for a full time research position. This position is within the Animal Science department, in Dr. Zhou's lab.
- The Junior Specialist will conduct research in avian genetics and genomics related to (1) disease resistance to bacterial and viral infection in chickens, and (2) gut health with microbiome analysis in chickens. # C. Scholarships

#### 1. California Cattlewomen's Scholarship

- This \$1,000 scholarship is for both male and female full time students who have graduated from a California high school and have junior, senior, or graduate standing. Students must have an agricultural course of study and a minimum 3.0 GPA.

#### 2. NPFDA Scholarships Available

- The NPFDA (National Poultry and Food Distributors Association) Scholarship Foundation is entering its 36<sup>th</sup> year in scholarship assistance. They have increased their award amount to five \$2,000 scholarships, from 4 awards previously. Their awards go toward students in the fields of poultry science, food science, agricultural economics/marketing, and all other fields of study related to the poultry industry.

# 3. San Diego County Farm Bureau Scholarships

- The San Diego County Farm Bureau is offering scholarships for students who are permanent residents of San Diego County and pursuing a course of study in agriculture or a closely related field.
- A recommendation from a teacher or academic advisor is required, in addition to a recommendation from a current or former employer. Transcripts must also be included with the application (photocopies are acceptable).

- The California Woolgrower's Association Scholarship is set up to provide financial assistance to enrolled students in academic programs related to the California Sheep Industry. This support may be used to offset normal academic fees or to help offset costs of senior projects and/or research efforts.
- Students must have completed at least one year of studies in an Agricultural major, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. The award amount is \$500.
- The application requires an essay, summary of career plans, and 3 current letters of recommendation, along with verification of enrollment.
- Applications are due by June 1st, 2015. An application has been attached to this email.

#### 5. Silicon Valley Community Foundation Scholarships

- A variety of scholarships are available, the majority of which are for current of former residents of San Mateo and Santa Clara counties.
- Deadlines for the various scholarships will be throughout February.
