A. Announcements / Upcoming Events

1. Important Information for 2015-2016 courses

- The following courses will be offered in Fall 2015, and may satisfy specialization requirements:
 - EVE 107: Animal Communication
 - o NPB 130: Physiology of the Endocrine Glands
 - o NPB 102: Animal Behavior
 - o ANS 13: Birds, Humans, and the Environment
 - o ANS 18: Introductory Aquaculture
 - o ANS 103: Animal Welfare (Pre-requisites will be checked!)
 - o ANS 115: Advanced Horse Production
 - o ANS 140: Management or Laboratory Animals
 - o ANS 142: Companion Animal Care and Management
 - o ANS 143: Pig and Poultry Care and Management
 - o AVS 103: Avian Development and Genomics
- The following courses are also offered in Fall 2015, and may be used to satisfy laboratory course requirements:
 - o ANS 136A+ANS 198: Aquaculture Lab

- MCB120L: Molecular Biology and Biochemistry Laboratory Techniques (Pass 1 only open to MIC and MCB majors)
- o MCB 160L: Principles of Genetics Laboratory (Pass 1 only open to Genetics majors)

- o NPB 101L: Systemic Physiology Laboratory (Pass 1 only open to NPB and BIS majors)
- ANG 107: Genetics and Animal Breeding
 - Will be offered both Fall 2015 and Winter 2016.
 - This class is only available to students with senior standing. Students needing to take ANG 107 with junior standing as of Spring 2015 will need to wait until open registration to register, or take the course in Winter 2016.
 - o This course will not conflict with ANS 124 and NPB 121 for Winter 2016.
 - o Prerequisites will be enforced.

 - Will ONLY be offered in Spring 2016, and not in Winter.
