

Courses that Fulfill the UC Davis ELWR

To satisfy the requirement, students must earn a course grade of C or higher; students who receive a grade lower than C must repeat the course or take a different ELWR fulfilling course.

UWP 007: Practices in College Reading & Writing (4 units)

UWP 007 is a face-to-face course taught by writing faculty at UC Davis. The small class size of 18 students allows for intense mentorship and collaboration as students focus on academic literacy strategies, including understanding scholarly texts, contextualizing information, developing source-based academic writing projects, and learning how to implement feedback and revision plans.

UWP 007M: Practices in College Reading & Writing for Multilingual Writers (4 units)

UWP 007M is a face-to-face course taught by writing faculty at UC Davis. Students arrive at this course through campus placement or after successful completion of UWP 022. The small class size of 18 students allows for the development of multilingual writers' composition and English language skills across genres and disciplines. The course integrates college-level reading, critical thinking, and written communication, using texts from across the curriculum.

UWP 1A: Writers' Workshop (2 units)

UWP 1A is a face-to-face course that fulfills the ELWR. <u>Concurrent enrollment in UWP 1 (a course that fulfills the lower-division composition requirement) is required for UWP 1A students</u>. The course uses a writing-studio approach; each section of UWP 1A enrolls 14 students who work intensively on analyzing writing tasks, developing drafts of writing, providing and implementing feedback, and identifying useful strategies for academic writing across the curriculum.

ENL 3A: Writers' Workshop (2 units)

ENL 3A is a face-to-face course that fulfills the ELWR. <u>Concurrent enrollment in ENL 3 (a course that fulfills the lower-division composition requirement) is required for ENL 3A students</u>. The course uses a writing-studio approach; each section of ENL 3A enrolls 14 students who work in small groups and with an instructor who supports them as they complete disciplinary writing tasks assigned in ENL 3, including literary analysis of poetry, drama, and fiction.

NAS 5A: Writers' Workshop (2 units)

NAS 5A is a face-to-face course that fulfills the ELWR. <u>Concurrent enrollment in NAS 5 (a course that fulfills the lower-division composition requirement) is required for NAS 5A students</u>. The course uses a writing-studio approach; each section of NAS 5A enrolls 14 students who work on writing-intensive tasks through the lens of Native American literature.

WLD 57: College Writing (4.5 workload units)

WLD 57 is a face-to-face course taught by Sacramento City College faculty on the UC Davis campus. The 4.5 units of the course count toward the minimum progress requirement but do not carry units toward graduation credit, nor do they factor into a student's GPA. In this course, students will read and discuss professional essays and write a number of papers and shorter assignments both in and out of class. **P sections are designated for EOP students only.**

WR 39A: Intro to Writing and Rhetoric (4 units)

WR39A is an online, cross-campus course taught out of UC Irvine. In the course, students will develop their writing through language-intensive exercises, participation in community-based writing through blogs and forums, and completion of a writing portfolio. Students will also have the opportunity to experiment with various writing forms, ranging from a personal narrative to a thesis-driven essay project. This class rigorously prepares students for subsequent writing-intensive college courses. Students must meet eligibility requirements for cross-campus enrollment in order to take WR 39A.

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
