To remove the memory card

Push the memory card once to release it. When the memory card springs out, pull it all the way out.

IMPORTANT

Memory cards have front and back sides that are not interchangeable.
 Inserting a memory card facing the wrong direction can cause a malfunction of the camcorder. Be sure to insert the memory card as described in step 4.

Basic Recording


You can easily record movies with the camcorder.

Operating modes:




POINTS TO CHECK

- Before you begin recording, make a test recording first to check that the camcorder is operating correctly.
- Open the LCD panel to turn on the camcorder.
 - You can also press ON/OFF).
 - HFR52/R50 By default, movies are recorded in the built-in memory. You can select the memory that will be used to record movies (58).
 - By default, the camcorder will record in AUTO mode. You can select a different shooting mode according to the shooting conditions (\$\sum_\$ 59\$).




- 2 Slide the lens cover switch down.
- 3 Press START/STOP to begin recording.
 - Press START/STOP again to stop recording.
 - The ACCESS indicator will flash from time to time while the scene is being recorded.

When you have finished recording

- 1 Make sure that the ACCESS indicator is off.
- 2 Close the LCD panel to turn off the camcorder. You can also press ON/OFF.
- 3 Slide the lens cover switch up.



- To protect the lens, keep the lens cover closed when you are not recording.
- Observe the following precautions while the ACCESS indicator is on or flashing. Failing to do so may result in permanent data loss or damage to the memory.

- Do not open the memory card slot cover.
- Do not disconnect the power source or turn off the camcorder.
- Do not change the camcorder's operating mode.
- Be sure to save your recordings regularly (
 103), especially after making important recordings. Canon shall not be liable for any loss or corruption of data.

(i) NOTES

- About the power saving mode: If II > [Auto Power Off] is set to [ON On], the camcorder will shut off automatically to save power when it is powered by a battery pack and is left without any operation for 3 minutes. Should this happen, turn the camcorder back on.
- When recording in bright places, it may be difficult to use the LCD screen. In such cases, you can adjust the LCD backlight with the IT >> [LCD Backlight] setting or adjust the brightness of the LCD screen with the IT >> [ED Brightness] setting.
- If you plan on making a long recording while the camcorder is in a fixed position, such as on a tripod, you can record with the LCD panel closed in order to conserve the battery's power. In such case, make sure
 Power On Using LCD Panel is set to [Off].
